

Extract from the waste tariff regulation (environmental score in force from 01-01-2024)

Art. 25 - Remodulations and reductions for separate collection for residential customers

With effect from 1 January 2024, each delivery to municipal collection centres, equipped with a waste identification and weighing system, will be attributed an "environmental score" which, multiplied by a fixed coefficient to be defined in the tariff resolution, will correspond to the reduction applied in the invoice.

The "environmental score" will be attributed in relation to the types of waste and quantities identified in the following table:

TYPE	QUANTITY	POINTS
Refrigerator, washing machine, dishwasher, freezer	1 piece	50
Single mattress	1 piece	10
Double mattress	1 piece	20
Spent car batteries	1 piece	5
Tv, pc, monitor and conditioners (splitter and gearhead)	1 piece	10
Small domestic appliances	1 piece	5
Mixed bulky items (cupboards, kitchens, tables, desks, chairs, wooden objects)*	1 m3	10
Bulky goods (sofas)	1 piece	50
Bulky goods (armchair)	1 piece	20
Sheet glass, demijohns**	1 Kg	1
Iron scrap**	1 Kg	1
Vegetable oils (the volume of the packaging containing the oily residue will be the decisive factor)	1 L	2

*for this type, no points will be awarded in case of delivery of a volume of less than 1 cubic metre

** for all types of waste counted in kg the approximation downwards or upwards referring to the unit will be applied

Each user, before discharging waste into the waste bins/dumpsters, must identify him/herself in accordance with the Regulations for the management of the municipal waste collection centre in order to be correctly identified and to allow the type of waste delivered and its weight to be stored. All types of waste that can be delivered to the collection centre, but not listed in the table above, do not determine any points for the purposes of tariff relief. Each user may use each of the collection centres in the territory without distinction.
